## Donald P. Sloat Medal of Honor Donated to the City of Coweta

The family of United States Army Specialist Donald P. Sloat generously donated the Medal of Honor awarded to Sloat in 2014 to the City Coweta. President Barack Obama awarded the Medal of Honor for Valor in Vietnam to Dr. Bill Sloat, the brother of the posthumous recipient, for Sloat's courageous efforts during the Vietnam War. The ceremony took place at the White House on September 15, 2014.

The Medal of Honor is the highest military honor given by the United States of America, awarded to individuals for acts of valor above and beyond the call of duty. On September 10, 2014, the City of Coweta hosted a public ceremony honoring Sloat by proclaiming September 15, 2014, as "Specialist Donald P. Sloat Medal of Honor Day" in Coweta.

Sloat, a Coweta resident, enlisted in the Army in 1969 and went on to serve in the Vietnam War. Assigned as an M60 Machine Gunner with







the 2nd Battalion, 1st Infantry Regiment, 196th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, Sloat saved the lives of his squad members by shielding them from a grenade blast on January 17, 1970, just a month before his 21st birthday.

"It is a tremendous honor that Specialist Sloat's family would entrust the City of Coweta with preserving and maintaining something so valuable," says Coweta Mayor Robert Morton. "The City recognizes the obligation to safeguard this award in perpetuity."

The City held a public dedication ceremony on February 6, 2017 at 2 p.m. at Coweta First Baptist Church with great support from local organizations and individuals.

Coweta lost more men per capita in the Vietnam War than any other community in the entire United States, including Sloat, Phillip D. Sanders, Edgar R. Pulliam, Jimmy L. Campbell, Billy K. Carver, Frank E. Faught, Dallas S. Perryman and Grover W. Boston. Fourteen of the 37 boys in the Coweta High School Class of 1967 fought in the Vietnam War.
