

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

Water System Improvement Projects

- * Work continues on the new booster pump station at the Sky View water tower. New pumps, piping, and a stand-by generator have been installed thus far. We are hoping to have this station on-line by the end of this year.
- * The City has hired a contractor to start the preliminary dirt work phase for the improvements to the Water Treatment Facility. The City is still awaiting a response from the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality regarding the final improvements to the Water Treatment Facility.
- * The City also has a contractor replacing water lines near Fairland and Guthrie. This project should be starting within the next few weeks and will consist of the installation of new six-inch and eight-inch waterlines that will replace the old existing two and four-inch lines. Replacing and upsizing these lines will allow the installation of fire hydrants as well and provide better pressures to the homes in this area.

Vernon Cemetery

* Replacement of the existing fencing at the Vernon Cemetery is underway. The City has hired a contractor to install six-foot ornamental fencing with gates along the west side of the cemetery as well as six foot galvanized fencing on the east and west sides. This fencing upgrade will definitely enhance the appearance of the Vernon Cemetery.

Coweta City Hall

Moving to the southwest corner of Broadway and Pecan. Renovations have started on the existing building and will be completed soon!

Water

Very soon the City of Coweta will be placing into service a new 18-inch water main as part of the City's ongoing multi-million dollar Water Distribution System Improvements Project. It should be noted that there is no anticipation that water service will be interrupted during this process. However, due to flow and velocity changes in the distribution system, there is a possibility that once this line is placed into service, you may experience discolored water. The water is safe and City staff will be out working to minimize the effects these flow and velocity changes will have on the water distribution system.
