Update from the City Manager

On February 8th, voters in Coweta approved the One For Coweta proposition. This one cent increase in the local sales tax, which becomes effective on July 1, 2022, is dedicated to paying for a variety of infrastructure projects across our community. The City Council prioritized the first set of One For Coweta projects to include: building a new public safety center, widening 111th Street S with drainage improvements, widening 121st Street S with replacement of a bridge, and improving the Coweta Sports Park. Engineering on these projects is expected to begin this spring with construction beginning for some projects in 2023. You can follow the progress of these projects at **OneforCoweta.com** and on the city's Facebook page. Thank you to everyone for doing your civic duty.



Over the last several months, the city has recorded three episodes of the Coweta Connections Online series. This video series is intended to provide an in-depth view on different topics, including city operations and other matters of community interest. The first three episodes include a discussion of what the city does to deliver safe and clean drinking water to your tap, what the city does with that same water when it leaves your house, and how the stormwater system functions. The videos can be seen on our Facebook page, YouTube, and our website at cityofcoweta-ok.gov. If you get the chance, take a look and if you have an idea for a future episode, please let me know.

There are several infrastructure projects currently underway in Coweta separate from the One For Coweta proposition, which you may have wondered about. A new 18" sanitary sewer line is being installed along Highway 51 between 274th E Avenue and 121st Street S that will increase capacity for current and future projects to the north and eliminate an existing sewer lift station from the system. The City Council also awarded bids on 13 road maintenance projects last year, some of which are still underway. The most noticeable of those roadway projects are along 111th Street S and 274th E Avenue. Additionally, Phase 1 improvements at Roland Park have begun. Finally, bids are being reviewed for the Coweta

TRASH-OFF:

Coweta Public Works is sponsoring its annual, free TRASH-OFF Day on April 23rd from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. The location for this year's TRASH-OFF is the old Cottonwood Acres subdivision on 151st Street S, approximately two blocks west of Division Street. Residents of Coweta who pay City utilities are eligible to participate. Please be aware that the following items will not be accepted: hazardous waste, chemicals, lead-based paints, petroleum products, tires, batteries, propane bottles, or construction debris. Unless it is a bulk item, it will need to be placed in a trash bag. Please bundle any tree limbs so that they are easier to unload.
